Matching

Myopia	Chromosomal abnormality exhibiting developmental delays (Trisomy 21)
Diabetic retinopathy	Hereditary brain disease involving progressive degeneration of brain tissue
Grid system	Adaptive equipment that aids the student in rotary
Glaucoma	Any device that puts the skis on opposing edges with femur rotation
Strabismus	Expressive or receptive vocabulary understanding
Huntingtons disease	Neurological syndrome that is usually hereditary
Fragile X syndrome	Temporary lapse of consciousness caused by abnormal electrical activity in the brain
Tethers	Increased intracocular pressure
Attention Deficit Disorder	Neurological disorder, also known as Pervasive Development Disorder
Autism	Chromosomal abnormality with symptoms that include cognitive delays, large ears, long face and is more common in boys
Ski tip connector	Near sightedness
Aphasia	Eye turn
Seizure	Guiding technique with distance parameters
Cerebral Palsy	Vision loss resulting duration of diabetes
Down Syndrome	A non progressive disability caused at birth
